I have worked in social services and education for over 25 years. In 1988 I graduated from Divine Word College in Epworth Iowa. In College I worked as an ESL tutor, tutored developmentally disabled adults, and began a big brother program for children who needed mentors. I spent summers in college traveling around the United States volunteering at shelters and soup kitchens.

In 1989 I went to Washington D.C to work at the Llewellyn Scott Catholic Worker House, a transitional shelter and soup kitchen. Many of the homeless population we served had below basic literacy skills. In addition to soup we provided help with tutoring and basic case management

In 1990 I graduated from The University of Dubuque with a Master of Arts in Religion/Theology that focused on the relationship between religion and culture. This brought me to spend three months with the Lakota Sioux at Pine Ridge Reservation working with many people who had only basic literacy skills and very little resources to help them.

In 1992 I received a Master of Divinity from McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago IL. During this time I served as Associate Pastor of Resurrection MCC, worked at St. Catherine's Catholic Worker House (a transitional shelter for homeless men and women living with HIV/AIDS) and worked for Open Hand Chicago. This was the most "eye opening" time of my life when I came to better understand the relationship of health, literacy and poverty. I worked with and served people who were HIV+, had only basic literacy skills and were either homeless or living far below the poverty line.

In 2002 I began teaching Adult Basic Education at the Blue Gargoyle Community Services. I worked at the Blue Gargoyle for over 6 years and in that time served as an Adult Basic Education Teacher, Director of the Youth Tutoring and Development Program, Literacy and Volunteer Coordinator of the Adult Learning Program and as Director of the Adult Learning Program.

In 2009 I founded NewWays Learning and Literacy Consulting because I believe that literacy empowers people. There is a direct connection between literacy, health and poverty that is ignored by society and we must do better. If people are to change their lives they must have resources that are accessible and affordable.

I have had many challenges in my life but I have always been able to overcome them and move on. This is due to the fact that I have had many opportunities and that many doors were opened to me. This is not the case for everyone and I believe that for those whom much has been given much is then expected. What I do is not a job but rather it is the way I choose to live my life because I know that I can do better.
